They were landed in the backwaters near Mobile, Alabama, and hidden from authorities.

He helped preserve the story of his father and the Clotilda slave-ship as did the families and later community schools through oral histories. The women raised and sold crops, and the men worked in mills for \$1 a day, saving money to purchase the land from Meaher.
